■ WHAT DOES THE FUND INVEST IN?

The Fund invests primarily in a mix of fixed income securities of U.S. issuers and other issuers from around the world. It can invest in these securities either directly or indirectly through investments in underlying funds. The Fund uses a proprietary quantitative model based on advanced research capabilities in the construction of its portfolio. The Fund uses derivatives to try to achieve a desired risk exposure and/or minimize the exposure to currency fluctuations between developed market foreign currencies (such as the U.S. dollar) and the Canadian dollar.

TOP TEN INVESTMENTS

HOW RISKY IS IT?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

INVESTMENT MIX

This information is not available because the Fund is new.

RISK RATING

Fidelity has rated the volatility of this Fund as low.

Because this is a new Fund, the risk rating is only an estimate by Fidelity. Generally, the rating is based on how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

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■ WHO IS THIS FUND FOR?

Investors who:

- plan to hold their investment for the medium-term
- are seeking exposure to a mix of U.S. fixed income securities
- are seeking income from their investment with the potential for capital gains
- are seeking to lower risk from currency fluctuations between developed market foreign currencies (such as the U.S. dollar) and the Canadian dollar

A WORD ABOUT TAX

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) or a Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA).

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series B units of the Fund. The fees and expenses - including any commissions - can vary among the series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1 SALES CHARGES

You may pay a sales charge when you buy Series B units of the Fund.

2 FUND EXPENSES

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the return you get on your investment.

The Fund's expenses are made up of the management fee, fixed administration fee, and operating expenses and trading costs (fund costs). The series' annual management fee is 1.05% of the series' value. The series' annual fixed administration fee will fall under one of the three tiers below, depending on the amount of Fund assets:

AMOUNT OF FUND ASSETS	ADMINISTRATION FEE
Under \$100 Million	0.095%
\$100 Million - \$ 1 Billion	0.085%
Over \$ 1 Billion	0.075%

Because this series is new, its operating expenses and trading costs are not yet available.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. Fidelity pays a trailing commission to all dealers, including discount brokers, for as long as you own the Fund. This is for services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you. When these commissions are paid to discount brokers, they are for services and any tools or other assistance that your discount broker may offer.

The trailing commission is paid from the Fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment.

OTHER FEES

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the Fund.

FEE	WHAT YOU PAY	
Short-term trading fee	If you sell/switch units within 30 days of the oldest purchase/switch into the Fund, you will be charged 1% of the value of those units. If you sell/switch units within 30 days of the most recent purchase/switch into the Fund, you may be charged 1% of the value of those units or have your account restricted/closed. This fee goes to the Fund.	
Switch fee	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2% of the value of units you switch to another series of the Fund or another Fidelity Fund.	
Fee for sizable redemptions	If you have been notified that you own a sizable percentage of a Fund, you will be subject to a 1% penalty of the value of the units that you sell/switch if you sell/switch your units of the Fund within 30 days of your most recent purchase/switch into the Fund. You may be subject to a 1% penalty of the value of the units if you fail to provide the required notice to Fidelity prior to completing a sizable redemption. This fee goes to the Fund.	

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■ WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
